For the cattle producers, good stocks of vaccine, drenches and lice treatments. Keep an eye on paralysis ticks on calves, good stocks of Python on hand.

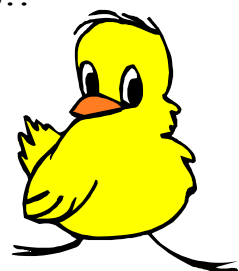
